## CITY OF MONROE RESOLUTION

1 2	Resolution Authorizing and/or Ratifying Actions relating to COVID-19 Emergency
3 4 5 6	WHEREAS, Chapter 52 – Emergency Preparedness – of the Code of the City of Monroe authorizes the Mayor of the City to declare a State of Emergency in the event of occurrence or imminent threat of epidemic; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, the spread of COVID-19 through our world, our country, and our state continues; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, the President of the United States of America has declared a State of Emergency relating to the spread of COVID-19; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Michigan has declared a State of Emergency relating to the spread of COVID-19; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, the first case of COVID-19 in Monroe County was announced by the State of Michigan on March 14, 2020; and
19 20	WHEREAS, COVID-19 is highly contagious and easily spread; and
21 22 23	WHEREAS, it appears likely that COVID-19 is capable of being spread by individuals without any observable symptoms; and
24 25 26	WHEREAS, there is presently no cure for COVID-19 at this time and treatment and/or cures are expected to take time to develop; and
27 28 29	WHEREAS, the mortality rate of individuals infected with COVID-19 is significantly higher than that of the seasonal flu; and
30 31 32	WHEREAS, social distancing and personal measures such as handwashing and disinfecting are the known means to mitigate the spread of COVID-19; and
33 34 35	WHEREAS, the City of Monroe, Michigan must continue to provide for the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens and businesses through its essential functions; and
36 37 38 39	WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Monroe, Michigan (the "Mayor") declared that a State of Emergency relating to COVID-19 exists within the City of Monroe, Michigan effective March 15, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.; and
40 41 42 43	WHEREAS, Chapter 52 of the Code of the City of Monroe, Michigan regarding Emergency Preparedness authorizes certain actions within the City to protect the public health, safety and welfare during emergency situations and disasters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the general closure of City Hall effective March 13 through March 18, 2020 to members of the public in order to decrease the spread of COVID-19 is hereby ratified (subject to the potential for necessary public meetings and/or actions which shall be disseminated and held in accordance with applicable law, rules and/or regulations); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all City operated buildings, including City Hall shall remain generally closed to members of the public in order to decrease the spread of COVID-19 through April 8, 2020 (subject to the potential for necessary public meetings and/or actions which shall be disseminated and held in accordance with applicable law, rules and/or regulations and subject to further decision of the City regarding closures); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the opening, closing, and/or occupation of any other City owned buildings shall be determined in the discretion of the City Manager and/or Emergency Preparedness Coordinator; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all online processing fees associated with online submission of payments in amounts of less than \$1,000.00 from citizens or businesses to the City of Monroe (including but not limited to water bills, recreation fees, and building department permits or applications) shall be eliminated and/or waived during the duration of the State of Emergency relating to COVID-19 to the maximum extent possible. To the extent such fees are unable to be immediately waived due to software or vendor timeframes for implementation, such fees shall be refunded to the payor as soon as practicable; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a moratorium on residential water shutoffs for all accounts administered by the City during the duration of the State of Emergency provided that all use during the duration of the State of Emergency will be billed and that shutoffs may be initiated in the event that the use substantially exceeds the typical and ordinary domestic use for the residential structure in question; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City's Human Resources Department, in conjunction with the City Manager shall develop a Pandemic Leave Time policy with the goal to provide City employee's with an additional bank of twenty (20) days of paid time off for possible use related to any potential exposure to COVID-19; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager and/or Emergency Preparedness Coordinator shall be empowered to develop policies and procedures for the conduct of purchasing and bidding that 1) limit, to the extent practicable, personal and/or close contact between individuals and 2) encourage the transaction of business via electronic, telephone, streaming, or other remote access technologies to the maximum extent possible, so long as public notice, access and/or participation as appropriate is preserved; and
